anyone seeking a strong, practical start in the TEFL industry.

It is essential to have basic digital skills (Microsoft Word, for example).

PROGRAM: Training course on modern English teaching methodology, including how to

teach vocabulary, reading, listening, grammar, phonology, speaking and writing in a student-centred and communicative way. The course includes six hours of **assessed** teaching practice with real pre-and upper-intermediate adult students.

During the course, trainees have to complete four written assignments.

The final grade is based on both the teaching practice grades and on the four

assignments.

CERTIFICATE: Upon successful completion of the course, you will receive a Cambridge English

CELTA certificate, issued by Cambridge English. The qualification is valid for life.

The application process and pre-course work:

- 1: Please complete the enclosed application form by hand and upload a scanned copy using the following link: https://bit.ly/celta_dropbox. Contact Stella Coel if you have questions at stella.coel@flyingteachers.com.
- 2: If the application and writing tasks are considered suitable, you will be invited to an information session/interview with your future course tutor. The information session aims to provide you with some essential information about CELTA and it also includes a one-to-one interview. In addition, it will give you the chance to see the school premises.
- 3: If you and the course tutor consider that CELTA is the right course for you, you will be asked to sign a course contract and you will receive an invoice that must be paid within 20 days. It is only after these two procedures (contract and payment) that your participation in the course is confirmed. To prevent last minute changes, this is generally done one month before course start date.
- 4: Within four weeks of course start date, cancellations and refunds will not be possible. Please read the course conditions you will find at the end of this document.
- 5: The pre-course preparation stage involves:
 - Completion of pre-course work after you get access to the Flying Teachers CELTA platform. This is done about three weeks before the course start date.
 - The pre-course mandatory reading is the book **Learning Teaching by Jim Scrivener**, MacMillan Books for Teachers. The cost of the book is **not** included in the course fee.
- 6: The course is offered on a "first come, first served basis", but we recommend that you should send your completed application at least two months before the course start date.
- 7. Before you register for the course, please remember: Former trainees highlight that they spend on average six hours for planning each lessons that they teach to real learners. This amount of time needs to be taken into consideration by future trainees.
- 8. Our tutors have successfully guided hundreds of trainees from diverse backgrounds, ages, and career paths in all these years. We run courses with a small number of trainees to give you the best possible support. Choose Flying Teachers and give yourself the best chance to pass your CELTA and launch your teaching career.

CELTA Course Terms and Conditions

Application and Enrolment

- 1. The course is offered on a first come, first served basis. We advise candidates to apply for the course at least two months before the course start date.
- 2. Eligible candidates will be invited for an interview. Successful applicants will be required to sign a contract and secure their place by paying the course fee.

Payment and Cancellation Policy

- 3. The full course fee is due four weeks prior to the course start date, unless otherwise agreed.
- 4. All cancellation requests must be submitted by registered post. Refunds are granted based on the notice period:
 - 80% refund of the course fees (20% retained) if cancelled more than 4 weeks before the course start
 - 50% refund of the course fees (50% retained) if cancelled between 4 and 2 weeks before the course start
 - 0% refund of the course fees (100% retained) if cancelled within 2 weeks of the course start
- 5. No refunds will be issued after the course commencement date. All retained amounts cover administrative and operational costs.
- 6. In the event that you do not complete the course or pass the course, your payment will not be refunded.

Policy for Unforeseen Illness or Bereavement

- 3. In the event of a serious, unforeseen illness or bereavement that prevents you from starting or continuing the course, you must inform Flying Teachers immediately and provide a medical certificate from a doctor approved by us (a neutral third party), at your own cost. Pregnancy and related nausea are not considered as 'unforeseen illnesses'.
- 4. If the doctor's certificate proves the illness as well as its unpredictability, you may reapply to join the next available CELTA course, subject to acceptance and availability. You must have recovered from the illness and be fit to undertake the course. This option is offered only once and is subject to an additional fee of CHF 1,000.
- 5. If illness occurs again during this subsequent course, Flying Teachers reserves the right to deny the opportunity to reapply without a refund.

General Conditions

- 6. Successful course completion requires 100% attendance and meeting all assessment criteria set by Cambridge English.
- 7. Acceptance onto the CELTA course does not guarantee future employment with Flying Teachers.

Under this program, you will:

- Teach groups of adult learners using a prescribed coursebook, following detailed course programs and lesson plans developed by our teacher training department.
- Receive ongoing support and coaching through our quality management processes and class observations.

This program is only available to **graduates of our CELTA course**. We always consult with your CELTA tutors to assess your suitability for Supported Teaching Practice.

Courses typically run for 2 to 3 months and can be intensive (daily) or semi-intensive (2 to 3 times per week). The lessons are held in the mornings, afternoons, or evenings for 2 to 3 hours per session. The course format would be either face-to-face or online.
